As the world continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, escalating crises - from climate change to conflict - have exacerbated gender equality gaps, with devastating consequences. Millions of women and girls are experiencing heightened discrimination and violence, food and economic insecurity, barriers to education and jobs, and limited access to critical health and social services. New data from UNICEF show that progress would need to be nearly 20 times faster to reach the Sustainable Development Goal target of ending child marriage by 2030.3 Girls continue to be twice as likely as boys not to be engaged in any form of employment, education or training, and their digital access and literacy is particularly challenging. Globally, adolescent girls face information gaps and considerable restrictions on their choices regarding their sexual and reproductive health and rights, underscoring the importance of prioritizing investments in adolescent girls' rights, including their voice, agency and leadership.

#### Introduction

The essence of Gender differentiates what women and men, and girls and boys, are expected to be and do. Although there are certain biological differences between boys and girls which can create different needs and capacities for each, these differences do not in themselves lead to or justify unequal social status or rights. The distinct roles and behaviours that are defined for boys and girls, and men and women in a society may give rise to gender inequalities.

UNICEF states that Gender equality means that women and men, and girls and boys, enjoy the same rights, resources, opportunities and protections. Gender inequality arises when one group is seen in a society as having more rights than the other. International declarations such as CEDAW promote and defend women's rights, and therefore, today, gender equality is promoted as a fundamental condition for the full enjoyment of human rights by women and men.

Jangipur college is strong minded to keep gender equality within its premises. It aims to maintain fairness of treatment for women and men, according to their respective needs. Gender sensitive features are carefully observed in every corner of the college by various activities like female teacher representation in governing body, selection of female teachers as convenor as well as a member of different academic, administrative and financial committee, Students' Welfare Cell, Anti- ragging Measures, Internal Complaints and Harassment Prevention, separate boy's and girl's common room with cleaned hygienic toilet facilities, installation of vending machine, showing documents on gender need, health and mental counselling by expertise, arrangement of gender awareness programme, display gender specific issue in different corners of the building etc. By providing adequate facilities to girls, gender equality is kept upright in the college.

### **About the College**

Jangipur College is situated in a rural locality of the district of Murshidabad in West Bengal having a campus area of 5.05 acres. The College was established in August 1950 with Intermediate Classes. Undergraduate courses were started in the college from the academic session 1956-1957. The college was set up with the objective of imparting higher education mainly to the backward rural population comprising SC, ST, Minority Communities and women of the locality and to contribute to the educational, social, cultural and economic upliftment of the people of Jangipur. The vision of the college is to disseminate quality education and produce responsible citizens of the country who in turn would nurture the rich-composite culture of the nation. The college has received

recognition of UGC under Section 2(f) of the Act and is receiving financial assistance from UGC under Section 12(B). The college offers courses in Arts, Science and Commerce streams at the undergraduate level. The college is affiliated to the University of Kalyani since the year 1999 as per the decision of West Bengal Govt. It is a grant-in-aid institution of the West Bengal government.

The mission of the college is to offer innovative and socially relevant skills to our students. We take care to empower our female students and cater to the diverse needs of SC, ST, OBC and Minority students. Jangipur College focuses upon imparting education as a life-enhancing, man-making, character-building assimilation of ideas and the students are inspired to discover their innate potential. The college inculcates values of respect and mutual co-operation and thereby end endeavours to contribute towards the society, nation and the world.

In 2007 the college was awarded a B+ Grade by NAAC in Cycle – I. In 2017 NAAC evaluation for Cycle – II graded the college with B++ status, second in terms of quality in the entire district of Murshidabad. Consequently, the college has received financial assistance from Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) and is a beneficiary of RUSA 2.0 scheme. Presently the college is preparing for the evaluation of Cycle – III by NAAC.

#### What is Gender Audit?

Gender Audit is an attempt to study whether the college has a good gender balance. It tries to see whether college follows government rules, policies and actions formulated for up-gradation of women in society. The Gender Audit tries to access the impact of the institution's current and proposed policies on gender equality.


female staff are given the responsibility of being convenors in different subcommittees. Two female members are there in IQAC of this college.




### **Non-Teaching Staff**

## Sex-Wise Distribution of Non-Teaching Staff (Including Casual Staff)





#### Figure (3)




Table 3 represents gender wise distribution of students along the caste for students of 2022-23 session. It is very interesting to note that the number of female students enrolled in this college along all social categories is higher than the number of male students. The overall percentage of female student enrolled in this session is marginally higher than 57 percent. The absolute figures show there were 5422 female students against 4082 male students enrolled. The vertical bar diagram shown in Figure 4 represents the data presented in Table -3. Here all the blue bars, that represent female student's enrolment data, is taller than that for male students.

The following four table represents the data for gender wise enrolment of total students along different programmes and year wise separately as well. It is unfortunate that pure science subjects are not widely accepted among girls. It has remained as one of the most male-dominated segments of studies. But, it is also evident that girls' participation is much higher than boys' in bio-sciences. Girls are taking more interest in subjects like Zoology or Botany than pure science subjects, i. e., Mathematics, Physics & Chemistry. It is clearly visible from the figures presented that still educational choices are highly gendered. Girls' underrepresentation in science subjects is deep rooted and puts a detrimental brake on progress towards sustainable development.






Table 8 and the corresponding Figure 9 represent intertemporal data of sexwise distribution of student enrolment for the last five years, i.e., 2018-19 to 2022-23. Here we get a bit of pleasant picture of movement towards gender equality. Female student's participation for the last five years has always been higher than that of male. Apart from that female student's enrolment has increased from 50.97 percent to 57.05 percent. The increase in female student's number in absolute terms is more noticeable. This increase in their number implies that the initiatives taken by the college authority to move towards gender equality seems to have created a favorable ambiance for the female students, which is very significant.





Table 11: Number of Students Enrolled in NSS 2022-23

## **Gender Sensitization Initiatives**

By forming various committees like Anti-ragging Cell, and Prevention of Sexual Harassment Cell and at the same time by providing adequate facilities to girls, gender equality is kept uncompromised in the college.

The following initiatives have been undertaken by the College for the convenience of girl students:

Jangipur College has always witnessed an Overwhelming inflow of students. To avoid rush and other mishaps, separate provisions have been arranged at various strategic places for girls.

- 1. Separate Entrance with Guards: The separate entrance avoids chaotic situations. It is one of the safety measures for girls. In addition, the college is under CCTV surveillance 24x7.
- 2. Ladies Common Room: There is adequate space in the Ladies Common Room with a separate space dedicated to Day Care Centre and the entire zone is attended by a lady attendant. Washroom provision has also been made for girls in the Ladies' Room with a sanitary napkin vending and disposal unit.
- 3. Girls' Washroom: Girls' washrooms are situated at two different places in the college with ample water supply and proper maintenance.
- 4. Drinking Water: Water coolers and water purifiers have been provided for boys and girls in the College campus.

The college has established several committees to aid girl students and lady staff. These committees include:

- 1. **Anti-Ragging Committee:** The college publishes its regulations in the prospectus. Ragging is a criminal offence and UGC has notified regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in educational institutions. In order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging the College has formed an Anti-Ragging Committee. The students in distress owing to ragging related incidents can approach the Committee. The Committee has 3females, 7 males
- 2. Women's Cell: Women Empowerment and Gender Equality are the most important requirements for the upliftment and progress of our nation. In the effort to make Jangipur College a strong kernel of gender sensitization, the Women's Cell was constituted in 2013. The forum has both the faculty and nonteaching of the College as its members and works with an aim to create a gender sensitized community within campus as well as in the society. It has been organizing various skill enhancement, academic, technical, medical, cultural and social events for the upliftment of women and strives to promote of the importance of gender equality in society through the College students.
- 3. **NCC for Girls:** The NCC unit for girls provides a suitable environment for taking up a career in the armed forces. The girls are trained and motivated for leadership in all walks of life.
- 4. NSS for Girls: Our institute has NSS to sensitize students towards societal issues and community services, activities of which are mainly carried out by the students. The NSS unit for girls provides a suitable environment for taking up a career in the social services. The girls are trained and motivated for all kinds of

social work in the field enabling them to realize the importance of community service. They are thereby motivated to serve the society and the nation.

Internal Complaints Committee: The College has constituted an Internal 5. Complaint Committee (ICC) as per the Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act and Rule 2013. Having raised the bar of responsibility and accountability in the Vishaka Guidelines, the Supreme Court placed an obligation on workplaces, institutions and those in positions of responsibility, to uphold working women's fundamental right to equality and dignity at the workplace. Three key obligations were imposed on institutions to meet that standard, namely-Prohibition, Prevention and Redress. In 2013, the Government of India notified the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act. Consistent with the Vishaka judgment, the Act aspires to ensure women's right in work place in terms of equality and protection from sexual harassment through compliance with the stipulations of the said Act. It is important to note that the Act provides a civil system of remedy for the aggrieved women in addition to other laws that are currently in force. Consequently, any woman who wishes to report instances of sexual harassment at the workplace has the right to take recourse of both civil and criminal proceedings. The college from 2022-23 has devised a portal in its website to address and redress any untoward incident related to sexual harassment.


